

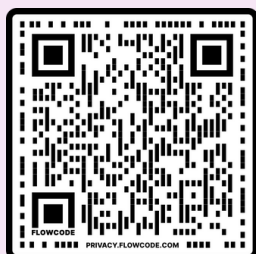

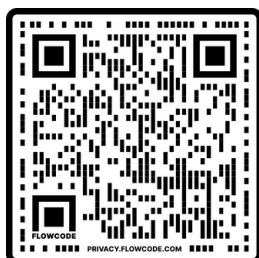
ACCESSING NALOXONE

IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

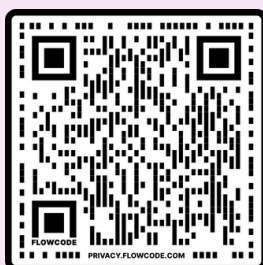
Naloxone (also known by its brand name Narcan) is a widely available Opioid Overdose Reversal Medication that temporarily reverses the effects of an opioid overdose. If you or someone you love uses opioids or drugs that may be laced with them, Opioid Overdose Reversal Medications can help save a life. 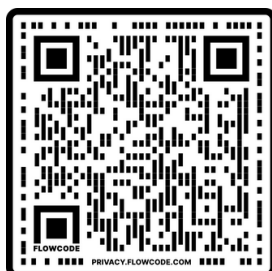
University of New Hampshire provides a free training on how to reverse an opioid overdose with Naloxone. When the training is completed, participants receive a free naloxone kit in the mail.



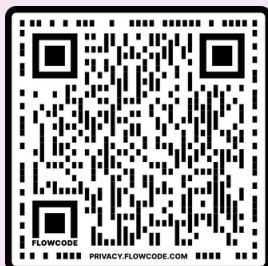
NHHRC supports those with substance use disorder in collaboration with other harm reduction programs and provides harm reduction supplies directly to those who use drugs.
